Announcements

A new outreach program, thanks to the partnership of Bethlehem Christian Outreach Mission and Pastor Don Thomas, our Page One Chaplain, has been initiated and already dozens of elderly Page County families are benefiting. Families with the head of the household over 60 that need help due to health issues and low income are eligible to receive a bag of food two times a month. The food is provided by the Blue Ridge Food Bank and from local churches. In January 2020 we had 53 family units, with 123 family members, receive this food. In February the number of families increased to 63.

The outreach group now serves people from the age of 65 to 98 with the average being 74. Most of them are t proud to ask for help, and many times find themselves deciding between medicine, food and utilities. We have 25 widows and some have children and grandchildren living with them. The group is not a food bank but provid a way to make things easier for those in need of healthy food. We only ask that they do not already get food from Page One. No names are taken except for those who need delivering. We need people who can deliver and take time to listen to those receiving the food. Giving means more than material items. Many times Jesus said to those around him to "feed my sheep". If you or your church would like to help contact Lois Shaffer or Pastor Don Thomas at Page One 743-4357.

Drop off your donations of used clothing and household goods at the new drop off shelter at our Food Bank/Family Assistance location on Bank Street. Place these items inside the structure to protect them from

the weather. Furniture and large items should continue to be dropped off behind the Thrift



Store.
